About Lord's Cricket Ground

The first match ever played at 'Lord's Cricket Ground' was in 1787, when businessman, Thomas Lord set up a new ground in what was then known as Dorset Fields. Moving twice since then, in 1811 and 1814, Lord's Ground has resided at its current location in St John's Wood for over 200 years.

As well as hosting some of the most memorable international matches in history, Lord's has recently hosted the finals of both the Men's and Women's ICC Cricket World Cup. In 2017, England's women defeated India in a thrilling final and 2019 saw England's men claim victory over New Zealand in a dramatic super over, creating sporting history as 'the greatest cricket match ever played'.



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
